Water safety, water tanks and ponds

There has been growing concern and a 'near miss' serious accident in the past experienced by a two-year-old on site involving deep water. Using the Gun-Site allotments as a model Firas and Keith have devised grills that can cover the tanks. We are piloting these on six tanks until July. Please provide feedback on these to us. Please can you ensure that all children are closely supervised while on site. Ideally ponds should be sited in the centre of any plot and covered with a grill or a surrounding barrier.

Peabody Gate Openings

Requests to open the Peabody Gate are increasing and not sustainable for staff or volunteers.

Background: The gate was originally allowed by the Peabody Estate in 2002 (the threshold is on Peabody land) for emergency access **only**, i.e. a ABLOY key and lock used only by all the emergency services. Over time the keys and locks have changed and essentially this means the gate no longer acts as emergency exit as emergency services cannot now access the site as they don't have our current key. We are now using the gate for skips, manure and woodchip deliveries and organised opening times which is not what was originally allowed by the estate.

Going forward, the committee propose to meet with the Peabody Estate to ask permission for the current use and plot holder general access. By meeting we do jeopardise the current usage and essentially should review having this gate just for emergency access for H&S reasons. We are exploring converting the lower main gate to be able to be accessible by the emergency services instead.

In the interim please could you kindly stick to the designated opening times as advertised below.

Human Faeces behind sheds

Our contractors, staff and volunteers have all come across human faeces on site, particularly behind sheds that are more hidden away and or near to fence boundaries. This is obviously extremely unpleasant and unhygienic for anyone to have to deal with. Please use the toilet at the bottom of the site near to the main entrance.
