# Skips

In order to organise rubbish removal we need ten volunteers to supervise hiring and managing a skip over one long weekend ideally before the spring survey. We have a budget for two of these this year ( $\pounds$ 1,200). In the past we have spent as much as  $\pounds$ 4,000 a year and they haven't been used as efficiently as they could have been. Below are some of the main issues:

- Skips are not filled in a space efficient way.
- Skips being overfilled which incurred an additional charge.
- Prohibited items being placed in skips which then incur an additional charge. We have had to remove pieces of asbestos bonded cement and tyres as well as incurring £108 additional charge for a small fridge.
- Outsiders using the skips on the forecourt to dump their own rubbish.
- Too much organic matter which should be composted

### **Biodiversity Mapping for Rosendale Allotments**

Why not have a go at formally identifying wildflowers, beetles and butterflies, maybe even a newt, slow worm or grass snake on your plot with a flora and fauna identification App. We could pool your finds and gradually get a better picture of what is living at the Rosendale allotments this year. There are several Apps but the one easy to install and use is iNaturalist by iNaturalist.org an independent nonprofit US organisation and supported by the <u>Biodiversity</u> <u>Network Trust in the UK</u>. You can download for free from your phone App store. Set up an account and take a clear photo of what you'd like to ID and upload. If you allow your location then the species is more easily ID'd and any same species distribution will show up on a map of the world, local area, and your approx location at the Rosendale allotment. Your ID'd organism is then pinned to the map too. The better/clearer the detail in the photo the more accurate the identification. Spring is a good time to do this as many species emerge from winter. If your species is very confidently ID'd by the App the count is added to their database - so contributing to a bit of science too.
